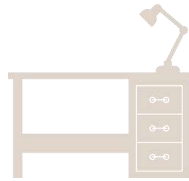

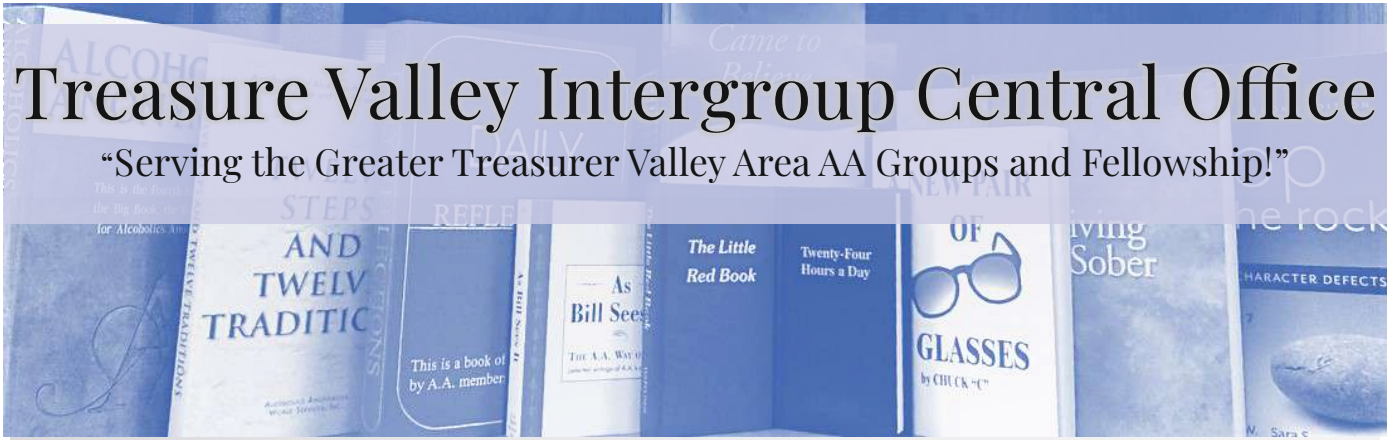

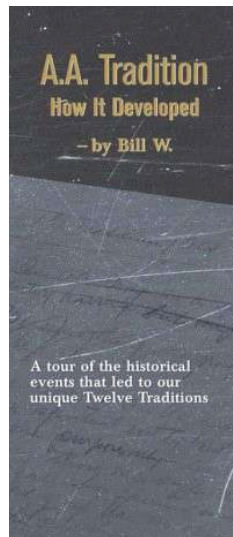

November Financials were presented by Teri and approved.

In Marya's Store Report she said that the Open House was a great success. It was very well attended on both days and Marti told her we did \$1,090 in sales, mostly on Friday. Hope you all received positive responses from your groups and friends, and possibly visited yourselves. She also reported that Devin feels confident that most all IT issues have been resolved and expects, barring any unforeseen circumstances, that things will move smoothly now.

David H had notified Marya that there was a slight glitch when the Website went live. Northwind had to open some access link and then everything proceeded smoothly.

Chuck will consult with David H to fine tune our survey questions. He will then notify the Steering Committee, who will review the survey and we will then notify everyone we can that the survey will be available to respond to on the Website and made available to whomever else wants it from Jan. 1 – Jan. 31, 2023.

Chuck is continuing to pursue access to the "Intergroup Offices of Alcoholics Anonymous" Symposium report for our store staff.

Teri has developed an official letterhead for TVICO that most all correspondence to our AA community should be utilized for.

Capella has written a letter to Nick Evans, Area 18 Chair, asking if they have a record of a written agreement between them and TVICO regarding housing the Area archives at the Central Office. Our staff could not find a record of such an agreement. If they do not, then I requested that he appoint several Area representatives to work with us in developing a formal agreement, agreeable to both parties.

We have had a person hanging out at the store, with no intentions of getting sober for more than 3 days. Marti told Marya that she can not get her duties done, because this person wants to talk to her. We believe, ultimately, that we should have the same 'no loitering' policy as any other place of business, if the person is not seeking help in getting sober.

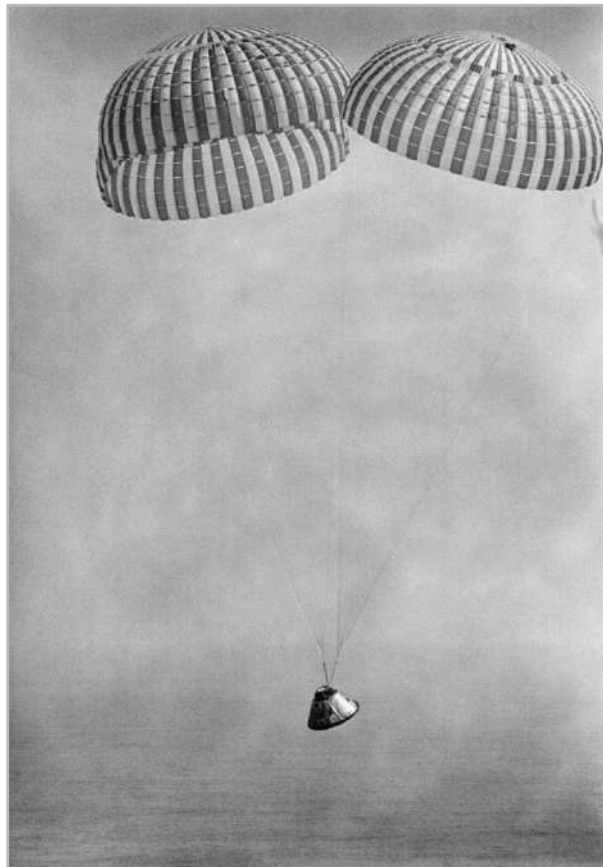

One Last Meeting

In a strange city far from his home group, an AA shares his story

This is a letter I mailed to the DeKalb, Illinois, Alano Club on behalf of an AA member, sober for twenty-eight years.

Dear DeKalb Alano Club:

Yesterday my sponsee Bill B. and I had the privilege of making a Twelfth Step call on one of your former club members, John McD., who is in a hospice dying from lung cancer. John moved to Las Vegas about five years ago. He was only here a short time and became very ill. During the past few years, John has been more in the hospital than out, and never had a chance to get involved with AA in Las Vegas.

My sponsee's sister works in the critical care unit, where John was told yesterday morning that aggressive treatment would only extend his life by a few months. John had been in so much pain for so long, he chose to discontinue treatment and have all life support systems removed. This choice gave him less than thirty days.

John asked the attending nurses if they would call AA and have someone come by. He had put on his admission documents that he was an alcoholic, and the nurses presumed he was an active alcoholic and wanted to get connected to AA before he died. It seemed a strange request; he was certainly not going to ever drink again. He said it was a spiritual matter.

I guess the nurse assumed he was concerned for his salvation. She contacted a Catholic priest, who came by and visited, then told the nurse that John had been expecting someone else. Again, the well-meaning nurse thought that John might be a Protestant, and she contacted the hospital chaplain. The chaplain visited; he, too, said John had been expecting someone else.

Certain that John was confused, the nurse had the staff psychiatrist call on him. The psychiatrist was only in the room a few minutes and grasped the spiritual nature of John's request: He indeed wanted to see someone from AA.

The nurse, who is my sponsee's sister, called him. Bill was erroneously told that a gentleman in the facility was dying from alcoholism and wanted someone from AA to visit. Bill called me to go with him on the Twelfth Step call. We weren't sure what we would tell someone in a hospice about the near-term benefits of gaining sobriety. We had no idea John had been sober for twenty-eight years.

The old-timers told me when I first came around AA that I never had to be alone again. . . they kept their promise.

Arriving in John's room, we found him with his daughter, Debbie. I told her we were from AA and she lit up like a casino bingo sign. So did John. John was pretty weak and was speaking in a whisper, but when he saw us he smiled and said, "Thank you. Thank you for coming."

We could barely make out what he was saying. He whispered, "I've been sober since August 12, 1979, and I love AA." I told John it was an interesting coincidence that he and I were both from the sober class of 1979 and that classmates should stick together. He laughed. The visit was off on the right track.

As we continued to visit, John got more animated and his voice got stronger and more understandable. Before we left, he was laughing a lot as we shared stories.

Two days earlier, John had had the opportunity to make amends to his first wife, who had divorced him forty years ago. His daughter Debbie told us later that John had been trying to make amends to her mother ever since he had been sober, and she would never give him the opportunity.

Debbie called her mom and said, "My dad's dying and I think it would be a decent thing for you to let him make his amends." The ex-wife said she would give John fifteen minutes to get it off his chest. She spent more than two hours with him, said she would be back to visit again, and was glad she'd come. Debbie said she watched forty

years of hatred and anger melt away in one afternoon.

John said he'd wanted someone from AA to come so we could tell newcomers that not only will God help you stay sober through anything life hands you, but even at the end, he's there to help you face the last challenge. "The old-timers told me when I first came around AA that I never had to be alone again. . . and here twenty-eight years later, even in a strange city, they kept their promise," he said.

John said he wished he could make one last AA meeting, so a few of us are going over today. He asked if we would contact the DeKalb Alano Club and tell his friends: "John finished the race sober and he loved his friends right to the end." Both Bill and I wish we could have known John much longer.

After Bill and I left the critical care hospital on Tuesday, they started sedating John to prepare him for his move to the hospice in Summerlin. The next afternoon, a group of us went to the hospice to have a little AA meeting with John. When we arrived, he was still sedated from the move, and his daughter Debbie said it might be hours before he regained consciousness. We stayed and visited with her; she looked like she could use the company.

She told us a lot of stories about John. He had owned a half-way house until he retired, and it rarely brought in enough rent to break even. But he said God always found a way to keep the mortgage paid. She said whenever you saw him he had a drunk or a sober alcoholic with him. He was always talking about how his life was saved by AA and that's why he needed to help other folks get what he was so freely given.

John died a few hours after we left, without ever regaining consciousness. But in that couple of hours on Tuesday afternoon, he was able to connect with AA again, and he knew his message to his AA friends back in DeKalb, Illinois, would be delivered: that he died sober and that he loved them.
