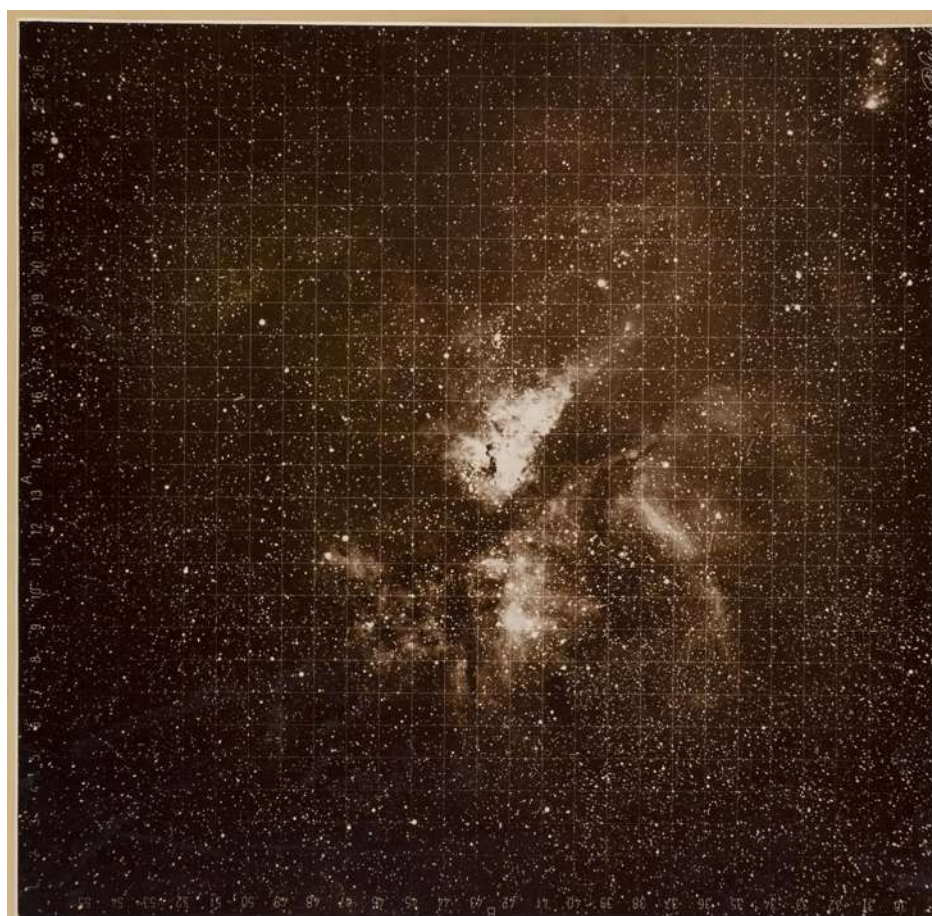
Hope offsets my crazy like a comfortable blanket or a childhood friend. Where she was once a stranger in my life, I carry her in my heart like a shadow.

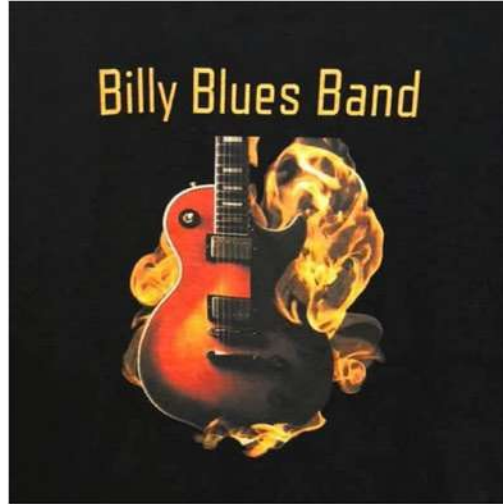
